Garden tasks for August

- ♦ Seedlings and plants growing in shallow containers may need watering more frequently;
- Plant seed potatoes that have sprouted;
- ♦ Prune fuchsias by cutting back ³/₃ and removing dead & inward-growing stems;
- Check pot plants to see if roots have grown through drainage holes. If so, re-pot into a larger pot with fresh potting soil;
- Remove old flower stems and dead leaves on perennials and work compost and 3:1:5 into the soil and water well;
- Don't be in a hurry to dig out seemingly dead plants. Cut away frosted foliage, lightly fork in compost and a sprinkling of a general fertilizer and water thoroughly.

Tips to get rid of ants...



Sprinkle talcum powder wherever you see a trail. Cayenne pepper and cinnamon also works. Wipe countertops and floors with white vinegar. Diluted mint essential oil works well too. Cornmeal kills ants that take it back to their nest they can't digest it.

Grow your own....

Spring Onions—are easy to grow directly from seed and even in pots and throughout the year. They will be ready to harvest after \pm 45 days. They don't have any enemies and their sharp aroma repels pests from other veggies. Pick from the soil while they are still firm and enjoy in salads.

Tomatoes—plant seedlings in a sunny spot. Prepare ground well with compost and 2:3:2. Tomatoes creep and will benefit from a frame or trellis. Add a layer of straw so that low-hanging fruits don't touch the ground. Soil must be moist so water deeply at least once a week. Look out for white fly, aphids and red spider mite—use an organic pesticide. Tomatoes are best stored at room temperature as a cold fridge robs them of their flavour.

Rocket—prefers full sun or semi-shade and well-drained soil. Water at the end of the day otherwise it will go to seed too quickly. Only harvest the young leaves when you need them—pick a few from each plant. Older leaves have a stronger flavour. Snails and slugs can be a problem! Rocket works perfectly with omelettes, frittatas, in risotto, with olive oil & lemon juice, stirred into pasta & salads. Yum...

Bay leaf—grow in almost any soil but prefer fertile soil to which plenty of compost has been added. Grow in full sun or semi-shade but do better in warmer climates. Harvest the leaves at any time. Thread bay leaves in-between meat when making kebabs for great flavour!
