2013 Travels with our District Governor Lion Jimmy Lang – By Lion Mike Wood

Lions District Governor Lion Jimmy's decision to visit the Northern Cape and Namibian Clubs early made a great deal of sense. Unfortunately circumstances did not allow these visits to take place during 2012, but it makes complete sense that the visits should be done early in the District Governor's year of office to carry forward the views and direction of Lions International Office as well as D.G.'s personal aims and thereby enabling sufficient time for changes to be made by the Regions and the Clubs in District 410A, if needed.

District Governor Lion Jimmy was accompanied by his lovely wife P.D.G. Paula Lang and Lions Club De Grendel's Lion Mike Wood [Charter Member of 38 years] and Partner in Service, Annette Wood. Over 35 years. Of travelling to the Northen Cape and Namibia 4 times a year on business trips, we had accumulated many customers, friends and knowledge of procedures, overnight accommodations, the roads, eateries and entertainments available.

It was tremendous to see how our former De Grendel Club Members have grown in stature, exuding presence and have become confident and knowledgeable speakers. D.G. Lion Jimmy and P.D.G. Lion Paula are really a formidable team and a real credit to the Lions Organisation. They were well received by all the Clubs visited and were much loved by all the Club Members.

During the 17 days we travelled close to 6000 Km in total. We experienced temperatures in the mid 30'C's to 48'C's which only dropped to 26'C and 28'C at night time. The Isuzu 4x 4 went like a Swiss watch, but there appear to be a "Bermuda Triangle' "operating in the vicinity of the Swakopmund Lions Club House, as approaching it, the Air Conditioner ceased to operate, also the Indicators, the Wind screen washer motor and the vehicles windows switch controls did not function. After their meeting, once outside "the Bermuda Triangle" area,4 blocks away, all these electrical appliance began to work and continued to work 100% ever since. Even though the DG.'s trip was hard going with early mornings and late nights [we began dinner at 23. 00 hours one evening], it was a most enjoyable one along with our easy going travelling companions and the outstanding generosities and hospitalities of all the clubs and club members. A special mention must be made of Chairman Lion Johan Van Es and wife Hanny, whose caring and accommodation for the visiting party was so generous that a 'Thank You Both' seems inadequate, as it does not convey the emotions of gratitude that we would like to express.

To the Clubs visited, similarly, a big 'Thank You'. We were treated, fed and welcomed with open arms.

The "Signature Projects "that Clubs have adopted [in their specific areas have been researched and greatly benefit their Communities. P.D.G. Lion Jimmy and I can't get over the amazing Vibe that one feels in these Clubs, the pride of belonging and outsiders wishing to join in the fun projects ,the general feeling of Good will is evident. We certainly laughed a great deal. Some of the Lion's Projects visited brought tears to our eyes, but made us feel proud of our association with the Lions International Organisation. All these Clubs are certainly making DG Lion Jimmy's 'Magic' in their Communities.

I will avoid singling out any Club visited, because the playing fields are not even, but one of the Clubs visited boasts that a third of it's membership are Leos who have entered the Mother host club. Two other clubs have started Branch Clubs this month, and I believe we will have a Namibian Club with highest membership in District 410 A shortly with

possibly 61 Members, 10 new members are being inducted in Jan./Feb.2013.

DG Lion Jimmy inducted 14 new members, and 1 branch Club President [Octavi] P.P. Lion Hans Ruhl. Jimmy passed on the International President's Message together with his own Aims for the year and with P.D.G. Lion Paula answered all queries directed.

At Swakopmund, the Club treated us to a 'BRAAI IN THE Desert' on the dried up Swakopmund River bed, in the vicinity of the screening site of Mad Max 4 December 2013. Talk about being organized .The enclosed toilet and flush cistern was ready before the rest of the camp was laid out, also frosties from the fridge with meat for the Braai. The following day we were taken for a Harbour Sea Cruise on a Catermeran in Walvis Bay Harbour, which is 6 times larger than Table Bay. We spotted Seals, Penguins, Sea gulls, Cormorants, Dolphins; some of these came on board for tidbits of fish. We sailed past the oyster farms and were treated to platters of these delicacies with Champagne. All too soon the cruise was over, the 4 hours flew by. 
