Then off to four days of Governors School, the entire team of our Multiple District was together in the same class, I must say school was fun and very informative.



Our International convention was attended by 55,272delegates the largest delegation ever to a Lions International Convention. This record was documented as the largest delegation attending a convention in Busan and was signed and forward to the Guinness World Record for insertion as the largest delegation to a convention. We will have to wait to see if this is accepted as such. The International parade of nations is an event that stands out for me, this year we were grouped in the area of Africa where all the African countries represented at the International convention walked together by country in alphabetical order. 21 Proud South Africans were a picture to be seen; we fully entertained the crowds and received much applause from the public.



The flag parade at the International Convention was a proud moment for me, the South African delegation waited patiently for our flag to be paraded and when it appeared their was a loud roar from us as we proudly stood up to respect our flag.



We attended various evening functions and interacted with many Lions from all over the world. We watched an amazing performance by a dance group of visual or/ and hearing impaired dancers and were amazed at their dancing perfection this group has danced around the world and received many recognition awards.



International President Wayne Madden was inducted as the International President and he proceeded to induct his governors 754 in total from around the world.



He emphasized teamwork as being critical to our success and so is having a road map and a plan to get there, he asked that each club uses the club excellence award as their blue print. It will ensure a club's success and it is easy to achieve with team work.



Our International Presidents theme this vear is "In a World of Service" he wants us to continue with the Global Service Action Campaigns of Engaging Youth (August) Working with the blind and visually impaired (October) Feeding the hungry (December and January) and Working to improve the environment (April). To protect 150 million children from measles in our new partnership with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. One dollar, One shot, One Child's Life saved. In addition he is asking Lions to participate in a Year-Long initiative called the "Reading Action Program" - a campaign to improve literacy rates and promote reading. Clubs please diarise the Campaign months and make sure that your projects are processed on the Club Monthly Activities on line as - Global Service Action Campaign. Communication regarding Reading Action Program has been forward to all clubs giving you project ideas and activities, we need to achieve at lest 50% of club participation in literacy programs. I urge you to embrace this project in your communities.

MY theme complements the International Presidents theme. "<u>Spread the Magic of</u> <u>Service</u>" "<u>In a World of Service</u>". Members perform magic by being involved in club projects. Communities are influenced and affected and touched by this magic. New members are seeds of magic, we need to plant the seeds of magic and we need to nurture the seeds of membership. My goals are the formation of one new Lions Club and 4 Club Branches, retaining current membership figures and clubs to grow by one at the end of this fiscal year.

We need to market ourselves and be visible in our communities with the Brand "LIONS". My main objective is to have an Enthused and Happy Membership who will strive to Grow our Organisation and uphold our common value "WE SERVE" the Motto - we share worldwide in 46,000 Lions Clubs.

#### MEMBERSHIP NEWS Lions Clubs International Records Fifth Straight Year of Membership Increase

**Oak Brook, Illinois, USA, July, 13, 2012** – Membership in Lions Clubs International increased to nearly 1.35 million members, as of June 30, 2012. While many volunteer organizations report declining membership, Lions Clubs International experienced its fifth straight year of membership increase. Not since 1993 has the world's largest service club organization recorded five straight years of membership growth.

"We chartered more than 1,500 new clubs, bringing our total number of clubs to a record high of more than 46,300 clubs," said Wayne A. Madden, the 2012-13 president of Lions Clubs International. "In the last five years, we have increased our membership by nearly 60,000 members. With a net increase of nearly 6,000 members in the last year, Lions can provide more service to their communities and to those in need around the world.""The fastest growing demographic group in Lions clubs is women, "says International President Wayne Madden. "Also expanding rapidly is the number of members from the same family. We are organizing family clubs and encouraging Parents and children and other family members to volunteer together. Family clubs or those with lots of family members fit easily into today's busy lifestyles."
